## What is ACES?

ACES (AmeriCorps in Eldercare Settings) is a project that seeks **retirees with professional experience and graduate students** to serve as paid AmeriCorps members (stipended volunteers) in a wide range of eldercare service sites. This is a great opportunity for retirees and graduate students to use existing skills, gain new ones, and try out a new career path!

## Why become an AmeriCorps Member?

By becoming a member of AmeriCorps, you will join the national effort to meet the nation's needs through service. A position at (Facility/agency name) will give members the opportunity to develop professional skills in healthcare, long term care, and leadership as well as to gain valuable experience. AmeriCorps membership is perfect for graduate students who want to get a sense for the long term care and home care industries and for retirees who want to try out a new career.

Hours are flexible—Perfect for retirees with seasonal homes or graduate students

## Compensation

In AmeriCorps, Members receive a Living Allowance as compensation for their service.

- Graduate students receive \$3,500 per year of half time service in assisting with “aging in place” (900 flexible hours).
- Retirees receive living allowances of \$4,700 per year of half time service in volunteer recruitment or staff training (900 flexible hours).
- Members will also receive an education award of \$2,362.50 after their service obligation is complete. The education award can be used toward college tuition, educational expenses and to repay student loans. Members 55 or older may choose to transfer this education award to their child, grand child or foster child to be used toward college tuition, educational expenses and to repay student loans.

## Requirements

Applicants must:

1. Have a high school diploma or equivalent,
2. Be 18 years of age or older,
3. Be an American Citizen/Permanent Resident,
4. Be able to devote 900 flexible hours over the next year toward service (tantamount to a half-time position),

## Requirements, continued

5. Have not been convicted of a criminal offense (all potential members are required to undergo a criminal background check), and
6. Have or be willing to get certain required immunizations.
